The operation of such equipment with a muffler can be used on a residential property or within 250 feet of a residential property when operated on a commercial or business property only during the hours listed below.

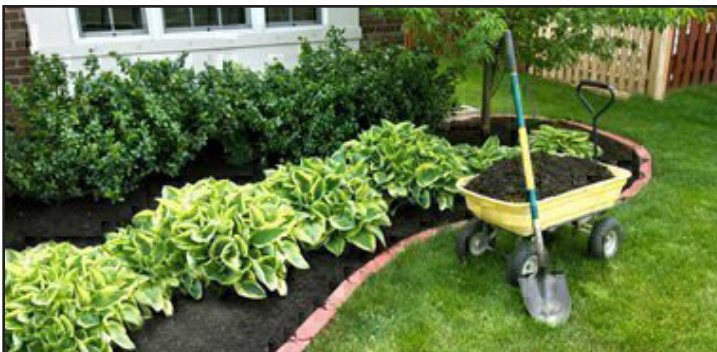

TRAFFIC SAFETY

With warm temperatures and fair weather finally reaching our region, we have seen an increase in speeding and aggressive driving complaints within our Borough. In response, our officers have increased proactive traffic enforcement details and issued a combination of over 2,000 summonses and warnings over the last several months to help keep our community safe. Over 300 were issued in the downtown business district to combat aggressive driving and curtail improper parking. Unfortunately, some of those drivers were Tena fly residents.

Our agency has always taken pride in the partnership with the community, and we are hoping to educate drivers by reinforcing the importance of traffic safety before we are called to the scene of a motor vehicle crash or on the side of the road during a motor vehicle stop. We are asking everyone to take a moment to reflect on their own driving habits with the intention of making our community a safer place.

If you have an appointment or simply can't be late, give yourself extra time by anticipating heavy traffic, construction detours, and having to stop for every red light between your home and your final destination. If you are behind schedule, please do not test the performance limits of your vehicle trying to make up time. Tena fly is not Indianapolis Motor Speedway and you are not Mario Andretti.

Always wear your seatbelt, pay attention to your surroundings, and give driving the proper amount of attention that it deserves. The days of simple volume and tuner dials on your car radio are slowly disappearing. Semi-autonomous driving features and advanced electronics are becoming more commonplace and often have the unintended consequence of distracting a driver from what is most important. If you have to swipe through multiple screens to turn on the radio, change the temperature, or enter an address in the GPS, please pull over in a safe location to do so. In addition, if you use a cell phone while driving, it must be with a "hands-free" device. Holding a cell phone in your hand while on speaker-phone is NOT considered "hands-free". Remember, when you get behind the wheel, you're transporting precious cargo; the safety of you and others on the road should always come before manipulating on-screen controls.

OTHER BASIC TRAFFIC SAFETY REMINDERS:



Speeding is a common cause of many "preventable" crashes. 96% of all streets in Tena fly are 25 MPH speed zones, and our officers conduct proactive radar details on a daily basis. To avoid the cost and aggravation of a speeding ticket, simply "drive 25."



U-turns and K-turns are prohibited on our downtown and business district roadways. If you want to turn around, please do so lawfully; obey clearly posted signs and go around the block. That parking spot that just opened up across the street isn't worth 3-points on your license and a hefty fine. Please don't do it.



When driving through town, you should expect pedestrians to be in the area. When they are, you MUST stop if they are actively crossing the road in a marked crosswalk which are located at almost all intersections in the downtown area.

Grilling Fire Safety



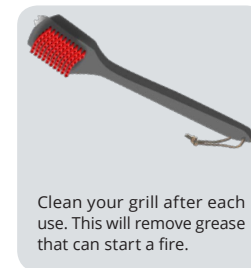
Use chimineas, outdoor fireplaces, and fire pits outdoors only and at least 10 feet away from your home or anything that can burn.



Open your gas grill before lighting.



Keep an eye on your grill, fire pit or patio torches. Don't walk away from them when they are lit.



Clean your grill after each use. This will remove grease that can start a fire.



Place the coals from your grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.

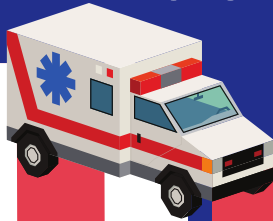

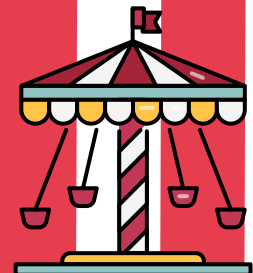

NO TIME FOR LYME (DISEASE)

Spring and summer offer beautiful weather to hike, play outdoors, or picnic but we are not the only creatures who enjoy an outdoor meal! Due to warm winters and an increased number of rodents and deer, tick populations are on the rise in New Jersey thus increasing your likelihood of getting bitten by a tick.

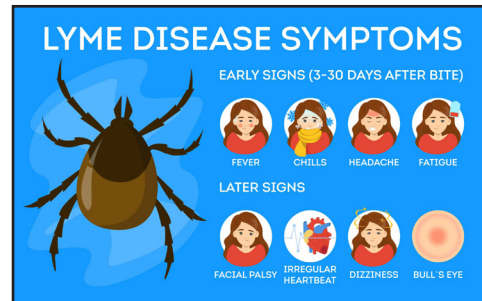
The most common type of tick in New Jersey is the black-legged tick commonly known as the deer tick. Deer ticks are known carriers of Lyme disease, Anaplasmosis, ehrlichiosis, babesiosis, and Powassan virus disease. Other ticks found in New Jersey likely to bite humans are the American dog tick, brown dog tick, Asian longhorned tick, and the lone star tick.

The deer tick is the only tick that carries Lyme disease. Lyme disease is the most prevalent tick-borne illness (TBI) in New Jersey. There were 5,897 Lyme disease cases in 2022 in New Jersey and in the United States, there were 62,551 cases in 2022. Sixteen people were diagnosed with tick-borne illnesses (TBI) in Tenafly in 2022 and in 2023 with a majority of the cases being Lyme disease, which is a dramatic increase from

2021, where there were only 5 TBI cases, and 2020, 7 TBI cases. The increase in cases could be partially explained by the pandemic delaying treatment and/or better lab testing for Lyme Disease.

Common symptoms of TBI can include fever/chills, aches/pains, fatigue, and a rash, such as the characteristic bullseye rash which appears in approximately 70-80% of Lyme disease cases. Untreated Lyme disease is dangerous due to its long-term impacts on the heart, joints, and facial muscles. ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION



The Tenafly Community Composting program celebrated over 10,000 lbs of Tenafly's food scraps diverted from landfill on Earth Day. Participating

families and members of the Tenafly Environmental Commission took a field trip to see where our food scraps have been going. Attendees were able to learn about the composting process, how it is done at scale for our town, and even take home compost for their gardens. Our food waste should never end up in landfill, as most currently does in Tenafly. Organic material releases methane gas, an extremely potent greenhouse gas, when it is forced to decompose without the presence of oxygen, such as in a landfill. Reducing food waste and improving food waste habits is the number one way families can positively contribute to the environment. 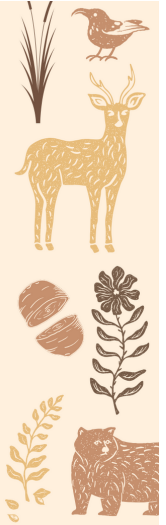

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

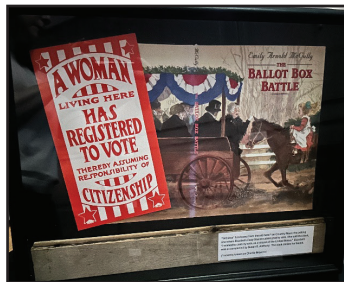
DEDICATION CEREMONY



The Tenafly Historic Preservation Commission held a dedication ceremony to mark the formal naming of the Elizabeth Cady Stanton Railroad Station on Saturday May 18, 2024. The event took place at the historic train station, which was designed in 1872 by Daniel Topping Atwood. This location served as a central transit hub for the town from its completion in 1877 until passenger service ended in 1966. The station was previously recognized for its significance in architecture, commerce, social history and transportation when it was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1979.

Elizabeth Cady Stanton was a pioneer in the women's rights movement in the 19th century. She is most often remembered for being the main force behind the 1848 Seneca Falls Convention, the first convention to be called for the sole purpose of discussing women's rights. She is also known as the primary author of the 1848 Declaration of Sentiments which demanded that women receive "immediate admission to all the rights and privileges which belong to them as citizens of these United States."

Stanton was a resident of Tenafly from 1868-1887, where she continued to fight for women's rights. She, along with her close friend and fellow advocate Susan B. Anthony, fought for the inclusion of women in the 14th and 15th amendments, launched a national newspaper, traveled across the country on lecturing tours, and wrote the first major history of the women's rights movement. Notably, it was from Tenafly that Stanton worked tirelessly for women's causes, often departing and returning from the Tenafly train station.



Coline Jenkins, presented to the Borough, an original floor board from the Valley Hotel (most recently

Charlie Browns), where Stanton attempted to and was denied the ability to vote. The floor board is to be displayed in the Tenafly Public Library for all to enjoy.



Coline Jenkins and Mayor Zinna had the honor of unveiling of the bronze dedication plaque, which features a rendering of Stanton drawn by Commission member Steven Standler.



Mr. Standler presented the original drawing to the Borough, and a framed rendering of the drawing to the owners of Café Angelique to be displayed in the café for all to enjoy.

Following the ceremony, the Commission's Chair, Thorin Tritter, lead a walking tour to the Elizabeth Cady Stanton house for all those who wished to partake.

The Tenafly Historic Preservation Commission would like to thank all who participated in the ceremony, including: Coline Jenkins, the great, great, granddaughter of Elizabeth Cady Stanton and president and co-founder of the Elizabeth Cady Stanton Trust; Nike Bach of the League of Women Voters of Northern Valley; Mayor Mark Zinna; Councilwoman Dr. Julie O'Connor; and Councilman Venugopal Menon. The Commission would also like to thank the members of the Girl Scouts, the Tenafly High School Marching Band, and everyone who came out to show their support and appreciation for this occasion.

WATER COURSES AND DRAINAGE DITCHES

Residents are responsible for maintenance of streams, water courses and drainage ditches on their property.

Section 12-4 of the Borough Code details the maintenance responsibilities of property owners and residents. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or occupant of any lot or tract of land across which there exists any drainage ditch, ravine, stream, culvert or other water source, to permit the accumulation of loose brush, fallen leaves, tree branches, dead trees, stumps, garbage, trash and/or other debris to the extent that such accumulation presents a risk of washing downstream thereby causing a blockage of said water course, and/or flooding or damaging of adjacent downstream properties.



COLLECTION BOX OPEN FOR USED CLOTHING AND SHOE DISPOSAL

The Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center accepts all used clothing and shoe items for recycling. Residents may bring all of these items to the Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center to be recycled. There is a Collection Box marked for these items. All items placed into these boxes are used, re-used or recycled into other items for use. Please consider donating these items. By reusing items we save the natural resources needed to make them and save space in landfills. Making new items from old products saves our community money, conserves natural resources and reduces pollution of air, water and soil.



BOROUGH RECYCLING CART REMINDERS

Recycling carts must be placed at the curb next to the street with the arrows facing the street. They must be accessible- do not place too close to mailboxes, street signs, telephone poles or behind garbage cans or parked cars. Only carts with acceptable items inside can be picked up. All recyclable materials must be inside the new carts. Plastic bags, Styrofoam, shrink wrap, metal items, light bulbs, pizza boxes, or wood items are not recyclable. No bags, no loose items and no other bins will be picked up. Please do not contaminate recycling with debris.

This event is intended for Tenaflly residents only and a Recycling Decal or photo ID Driver License will be required to gain access to the site. All documents received must be of a confidential and sensitive nature and will be handled in a secure manner to prevent the possibility of identity theft. To accommodate all those wishing to participate, residents are asked to limit their documents to 4 bags or boxes weighing less than 10 pounds each. Residents will be provided the opportunity to observe their documents being shredded. All non-confidential, paper material should be recycled through the Tenaflly curbside recycling program and will not be accepted at this event. Come out and take advantage of this convenient service for Borough residents.

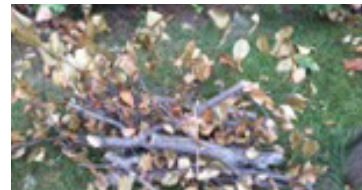
FREE TREE!

DISPOSAL OF BRANCHES AND TREE LIMBS

Sticks, branches and tree limbs from residents' yards are collected by the garbage contractor, Waste Industries. They must be put into a garbage can and placed at the curb for pick up on your regular garbage collection days. Large branches must be cut into lengths 3 feet or less and bundled for pick up. Do not use blue borough recycling containers, as this material is not recycled.

ELECTRICAL WASTE DISPOSAL

As of enacted legislation that revised the State's electronic waste management program to exclude electronic waste products from being disposed of in the trash.

As of January 1, 2018, all electronic items such as televisions, computers, monitors, desktop printers, desktop fax machines, laptop computers **must be recycled**. These items should be returned to the stores where they were purchased. The law requires these stores to accept them for disposal at no charge. In the case that this is not possible, residents may bring items to the Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center for recycling.
